THIS WEEKS SPEAKER, MARCUS GODINHO FROM FARESHARE SPEAKING ABOUT 'HUNGER IN VICTORIA'

How come in Victoria, in 2009, we have between 200,000 and 400,000 people who at some stage of the year will suffer hunger? Food waste – Victoria throws away 700,000 tonnes of food every year – the equivalent of 30,000 supermarkets full of food. And a lot of this is perfectly fit for human consumption. Think of the lost opportunity. Feed Melbourne – An exciting new campaign by Leader Newspapers and FareShare to raise \$1 million for the hundreds of charities providing food support to people going through difficult times. FareShare – How do 3,000 volunteers make 400,000 free meals a year for over 100 charities?
